Fort Sam Houston Quadrangle Completed in 1879, The Fort Sam Houston Quadrangle has been the home of a major Army command for its entire existence, and currently of Army-North, responsible for the security and defense of the northern hemisphere. The east wing is home to the Fort Sam museum. Its collection traces the history of the post and the units stationed there. Lackland AFB, with Fort Sam Houston and Randolph AFB, is part of Joint Base San Antonio,. The 37th Training Wing is the only basic military training and the largest training wing in the US Air Force. Lackland's major commands include the 24th Air Force (the Air Force component of US Cyber Command), and the 25th Air Force, which comprises the USAF's Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance missions.

Market Square, a pedestrian-only area of restaurants and shops capturing the city's unique Texan and Latino culture, is one of Frommer's "Top Ten Open Air Markets in America." At its center, the El Mercado Mexican marketplace of hand-embroidered blouses, pottery, leather belts, and piñtas. Next door, Farmers Market Plaza abounds in Southwest Art and Crafts.
